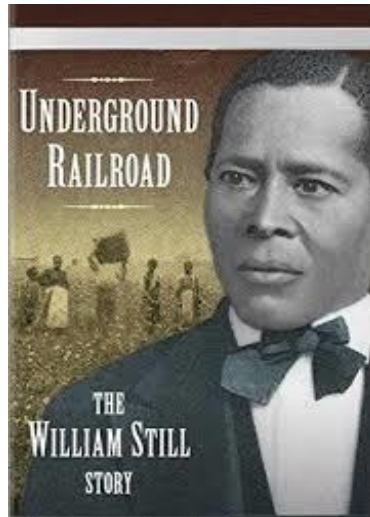

Documentary – The William Still Story



Hailed as the **Father of the Underground Railroad**, William Still was determined to get as many runaway slaves as he could to "Freedom's Land," smuggling them across the U.S border to the Province of Canada when it became the main terminus of the Underground Railroad, and a sanctuary for fugitive slaves. The newcomers migrated to various parts of what is now Ontario, including Niagara Falls, Buxton, Chatham, Owen Sound, Windsor, Hamilton, Brantford, London, Oakville and Toronto. Still kept meticulous records of the many escaped slaves who passed through the Philadelphia "station." Today his book contains some of the best evidence we have of the workings of the Underground Railroad
